Third call for enrolment aid grants for foreign students who are not EU residents and intend to begin an official master's degree in 2010/11.

UAB offers **30** enrolment aid grants for foreign students who are not EU residents and who intend to begin an official master's degree in 2010/11. Terms and conditions of the call are the following:

I. Description of the aid

1. This aid covers only the additional cost of enrolment in official master's degrees, including additional course credits, which must be paid by foreign students who are not residents of the EU, as approved by the Board of Trustees for the 2010/11 academic year.

2. For enrolment in interuniversity master's degrees the aid will only be available for programmes coordinated by the UAB, and therefore, when enrolment takes place at the UAB.

3. This call only includes university master's degrees which are subject to specific price regulations and offered by UAB centres.

II. Eligibility for application:

In order to apply for a grant, students must meet the following requirements:

- Be a foreign student not residing in the countries considered to be members of the European Union.  
The countries considered to be members of the European Union, whose residents are not eligible to apply for these grants are: Austria, Belgium, Cyprus, Czech Republic, Denmark, Estonia, Finland, France, Germany, Greece, Hungary, Iceland, Ireland, Italy, Latvia, Liechtenstein, Lithuania, Luxembourg, Malta, Norway, Poland, Portugal, Romania, Slovakia, Slovenia, Sweden, Switzerland, The Netherlands and United Kingdom.
- Have been accepted into an official master's degree *in the first round of pre-enrolments open until 18 June 2010 (those on the waiting list cannot apply).*
- Have an excellent academic record situated among the best applications for admission.
- Enrolled in a minimum of 60 credits, except in cases where the total number of credits in the annual plan for the master's degree is less than 60 credits. If the total number of credits is less than 60, applicants must attach file showing all credits offered by the master's degree during the 2010/11 academic year.
- Enrol before 13 October 2010.

III. Applications

All those interested in applying can do so by filling in the forms available at the UAB website.

The call for applications opens on **20 July 2010** and **ends on 15 August 2010**.

#### IV. Call procedures

For the allocation of aids, preference will be given to students who received the aid in the 2009/10 academic year and, having passed all credits, will register in all remaining credits to complete their master's degree in 2010/11.

1. The following criteria has been established for the selection of applicants:

1. Verification that applicants meet all call requirements.
2. Scaling of each applicant's academic record.
3. Applications will be arranged in a descending order according to the scale of each applicant's academic record.
4. Grants will be allocated in a descending order according to the scale of each applicant's academic record.

2. All aids will be allocated as corresponds to the Office of the Vice-Rector for Academic Policy.

3. The results of the applications will be announced as follows:

5. Provisional resolution will be published during the first two weeks of September.
6. Once the provisional resolution has been published a period of ten days will be opened for those wishing to appeal.
7. Final resolution will be published before 30 September 2010.

4.- The resolution will include names of students who have been selected to receive the enrolment aid, names of students who fulfil all requirements but remain on the waiting list, and names of those who have been denied the aid, together with the reasons why.

#### V. Revision of the allocation of grants

After 13 October, a review will be made of the enrolment of each student who has received the aid. If any of the requirements have not been met, the aid will be withdrawn and allocated to the next person on the waiting list.

#### VI. Incompatibility

These enrolment aids are not compatible with any other type of grant or financial support received by the student covering the entire cost of enrolment credits.

#### **Note:**

**Average marks of students in previous calls were higher than 3 on a scale of 0-4.**
